\*From 1973 through 1988 the competition was known as the Tournament of Champions consisting of teams from the Academic Athletic Association (AAA), the Oakland Athletic League (OAL), the Foothill Athletic League (FAL), the North Bay League (NBL), the Solano County Athletic League (SCL), the Marin County Athletic League (MCAL), and the Bay Counties League (BCL). In 1988, the North Coast Section leagues withdrew to compete in the NCS soccer championship. The Tournament of Champions transitioned into the Transbay Tournament, a competition between the AAA and OAL champion. The winner receives the Feibusch Cup, named after and donated by Lowell High School Coach Ernie Feibusch who played a key role in setting up the initial intersectional competition.

\*\*This was the final year of the Transbay Series as the OAL league moved both boys and girls soccer to the Winter season in 2009-10.
